

Long-Term Education Program: Crossroads Center for Youth (for county school students) and Lancaster-Fairfield Community School (for Lancaster City students) provides students who are on probation and having educational issues to attend. Attendance is mandatory and school work is closely monitored. Students may work their way through the level system in order to return to their home school.

Career Based Intervention combines academics, work experience, and career exploration. Students obtain employment and are in the work force for part of the school day.

Summer School is offered as an opportunity for students who are on probation to recover credits toward graduation.

I.S.O. Program (Individualized Structured Option) or Short-Term: Students on probation who have been suspended from school for short periods of time are required to attend the short-term program. High School students not on probation may be referred by their home school and attend with parental permission. Educational work is provided by the student's home school or the Crossroads Center. This program allows students to continue school work throughout the term of their suspension.

A.S.S.I.S.T. (After School Specialized Instruction and Supplemental Tutoring) was created to facilitate accountability for juveniles on probation through monitoring their time and to supervise and help them with the performance of their school work.

The **L.A.B.O.R. Program** (Learning, Attitude, Behavior, Obedience, and Respect) was created as an alternative to detention. This program provides supervision and structure for juveniles during the high-risk time period between the end of school and bedtime. Physical activity and discipline are the main emphasis of this program.
